Galilei's tablature is the only existing source of this madrigal composed for the *intermedii* performed before and between the five acts of a comedy, *La Cofonaria* presented 1565 during the celebration of the marriage between the Florentine Count Francesco de' Medici and Giovanna d'Austria.
