No. 1—CHORUS.

No. 19.—CHORUS OF THE PEOPLE.

Praise ye the Lord, and give thanks unto Him, for he has done marvellous things. He has redeemed us from our enemies; His right hand and His holy arm has gotten Him the victory. Praise ye the Lord.
