



The pieces in this book correspond in number, length and style to those in "Scenes at a Farm." The keys used are those which have not more than one sharp or flat, and the signatures, both for key and time, are inserted. The degree of difficulty is rightly in advance of Book I., but the difference is so small that it could be practically disregarded. Teachers will find the work useful not only for children, but equally for pupils of any age who need a beginner's book.
