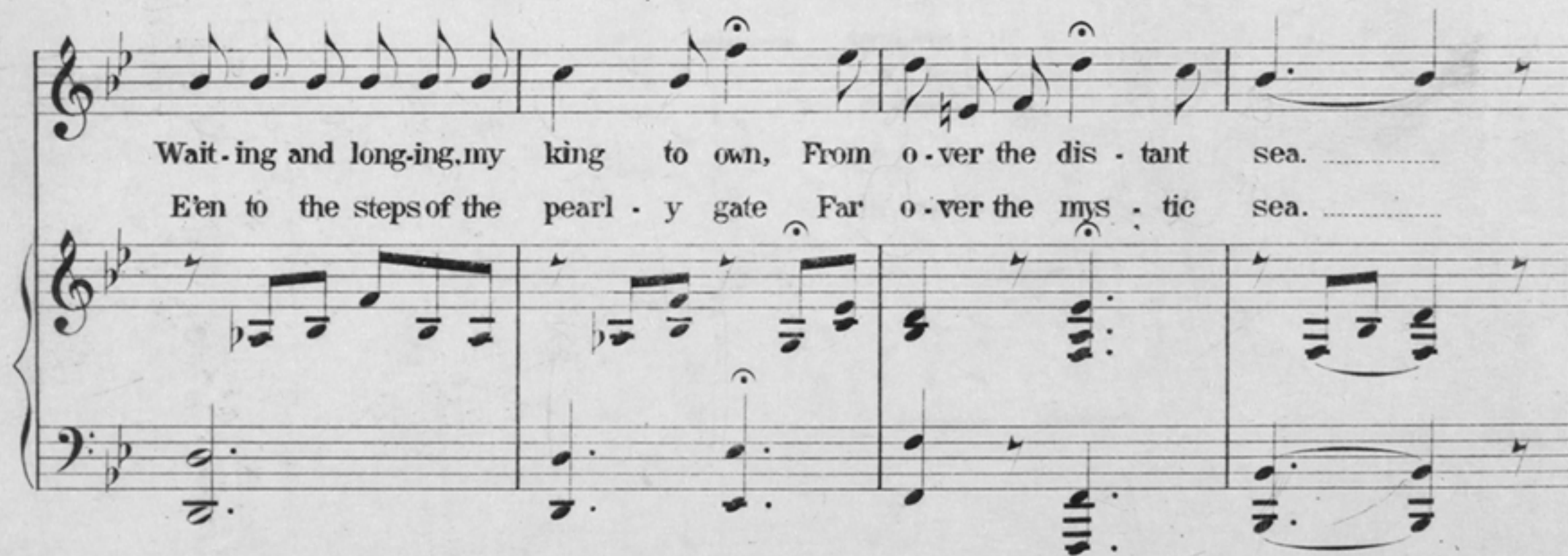
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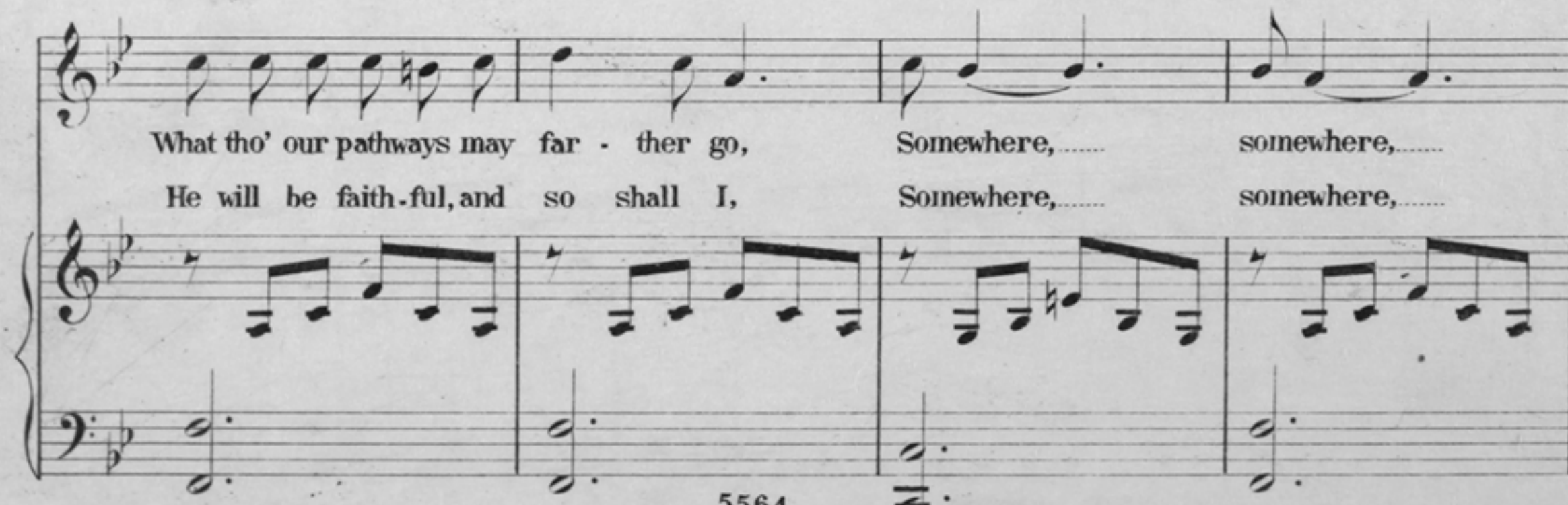
Whisper ye breezes of land and sea, And tell him I love him, where'er he be; O,
