#### PERFORMANCE INSTRUCTIONS

- Instruments are only approximately synchronized: do not attempt to play in tempo with other players.
- Sections of the score included in boxes with a departing wiggly line with an arrow at the end: This indicates that the section should be repeated and varied at will until the approximate location indicated by the • arrow. The variation should not add different pitches to the pattern in the box but can rhythm can be changed, and notes subtracted out.
- All metronomic tempos and section lengths are indicative. However the center section of the piece, starting at rehearsal B, should feel faster than the sections surrounding it.
- All players play from the full score. ٠

Percussion notation: The first four spaces in the pentagram notate the Toms, the space above the fifth pentagram line notates the cymbal.

#### PROGRAM NOTES

Bridge III is a strongly structured semi-improvised piece for piano, marimba and percussion. It was originally designed to be played in between fully notated, un-improvised, pieces, but it can be played as a stand-alone piece.
