
O gracious Lord!—subdued by fear,

To guard us from the threat'ning harm.




But if Thy judgments are begun,

Our only refuge is in prayer.





The shaft of Death is hov'ring nigh;

Thou with a word canst ward the blow.




Our sins oppress; we sink with them:

Come, join the "Hymn of humble Prayer."



Such an edition of Handel's Oratorios has long been a desideratum in the musical world, the plates of Dr. Arnold's, as well as the original edition, being destroyed.
